



The Pedal 4 Pinot Trail offers a self-guided FREE fun map to navigate a 25km loop around the Alexandra Basin.

The trail provides opportunities to taste delicious wines, visit boutique tasting rooms and enjoy the stunning Central Otago scenery along the way.

Predominately off-road, this trail can be started and finished in Clyde or Alexandra and cycled in either direction.













DIRECTIONS

The trail is predominately off-road and can be started and finished in Clyde or Alexandra and cycled in either direction.

If travelling clockwise from Clyde you can follow the greenway that begins at Naylor Street (between Fache Street and Hazlett Street). When you get to Orchard Street turn left and then right onto Hazlett. Then the next right onto Albert Drive where you follow the road around to meet the underpass on your left. Enjoy the beautiful mural by local artist Bruce Potter as you pass under SH8, before reaching the Trail Journeys depot at the head of the Otago Central Rail Trail.

If you are travelling clockwise into Alexandra continue along the Otago Central Rail Trail until you meet Tarbert Street. Here turn right and head into town, turn left continuing along Tarbert Street just before you reach the War Memorial. Take the next right onto Limerick Street and then the next left across the Alexandra road bridge. Just off the road bridge turn hard right down a steep track to meet the River Track.

TIMING

The total biking time at a leisurely pace is 2+ hours. We recommend you allow 30 minutes at each tasting room, therefore the trail can be completed in 4–5 hours, but this will be determined by cycling speed, fitness and time spent at each vineyard.

LUNCH OPTIONS

There are plenty of options for morning/afternoon tea and lunch in both Clyde and Alexandra. During the summer season there will be opportunities to purchase fresh fruit from orchards along the trail.

COST

The Pedal 4 Pinot Trail is free! Tasting rooms may charge a visit fee from \$5.

DID SOMEONE SAY PINOT NOIR?



Central Otago is well known for producing excellent Pinot Noir in a variety of different styles. However the climate is very well suited to also grow Pinot Gris, Gewürztraminer, Riesling and Chardonnay. The Alexandra Basin is a subregion within Central Otago and is the most southerly wine region in the world. It has a semi-continental climate, with extremes in weather. Long, hot summer days with cool nights, cool springs, long, dry autumns and cold winters create beautiful, fruit-forward, elegant wines. While visiting the Alexandra Basin, check out some of the other events such as the Wine & Food Festival at Easter, The Blossom Festival in September and the New Releases Wine Tasting Event at Labour Weekend.
